According to Bronsted-Lowry concept an acid is a substance (molecule or ion) that can donate proton, i.e., a hydrogen ion, H^+ , to some other substance and a base is a substance that can accept a proton from an acid. More simply, an acid is a proton donor (protogenic) and a base is a proton acceptor ...
